
We are the ideal stopover for any tour in the Eastern United States and Southeastern Canada.

Arrive in Williamsport just in time to enjoy a delicious lunch at Le Jeune **Chef.** After lunch, board a **Williamsport Trolley** with your step-on guide and tour the nationally recognized historic district Millionaires' Row. After the tour the trolley will deliver you to the **Thomas T. Taber Museum** to view the many artifacts and the La Rue Shempp Model Train Exhibit. After the tour visit the **Muncy Historical Society**. Don't forget Williamsport is the home of Little League® Baseball, so make sure to visit the World of Little **League® Museum**. Enjoy dinner at your choice of restaurants and retire for the evening. For a truly unique stop on your tour of Lycoming County, plan a visit to **Clyde Peeling's Reptiland** and see komodo dragons, parakeets, and dinosaurs.
